

Thomas J. Fogarty Center

The original gymnasium, located on the 2nd floor in the center of the high school, was dedicated on February 4, 1930 at a basketball game versus St. Xavier High School. Fr. Antonine Brockhuis, O.F.M., Director of the Georgian Club, Corryville, was the speaker for the occasion. This served as the primary gymnasium for over 50 years until the construction of the Thomas J. Fogarty Center.



IN OCTOBER 1983, ROGER BACON CONTRACTED GLASER & MYERS AND ASSOCIATES TO DESIGN AN ACTIVITIES CENTER.

A **\$2 million package** was put together which included the Activities Center (gym, band room, locker rooms, and athletic facilities) and renovation of the main building to develop more classrooms, as well as moving the library to the former band room and creating a computer lab in the former library.

When the design development cost estimate for the new building came in over budget, a decision was made to keep the original plans but break the project into two phases:

- Phase 1: Band room area; athletic offices, storage, locker rooms and the shell of
 - Phase 2: Completion of the interior of the gym, interior finishes and flooring, install lockers and pave the new parking area.

While the center was being built, Roger Bacon leased space in the former OLA building, which was named East Campus. This East Campus housed classroom space along with the gym for physical education and the cafeteria for a band rehearsal hall.

Ground was broke for the Activities Center on May 19, 1985. Sr. Anita Brelage, OSF, the Vice-Principal was the Master of Ceremonies. Fr. Jerome Schaeper, the Director of Educational Services for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati and Fr. James Bok, OFM, Principal of Roger Bacon, gave the addresses. **The** oldest living graduate (Mr. Phil Collins, Class of 1929), the Principal, and the youngest RB student (Miss Melissa Schramm, Class of 1988), had the honor of turning the first shovels of dirt. Fr. Andrew Fox, OFM, former Principal and former Provincial, Franciscan Friars, concluded the ceremony

with a benediction.

A fundraising campaign, "Roger Bacon – Expanding the Challenge," was initiated in 1987 to raise funds to complete the activities center so that it could be usable for the 1987/88 school year. Although the activity center was not completely finished in June 1988, the Class of 1988 did graduate in the center's gymnasium. The Class of 1988, the first class to go through four years as a coed class, was the first to use the gymnasium for an official ceremony.

The dedication of the center took place on Saturday, September 17, 1988 after 4 years of construction and a cost of 2.3 million dollars. The activity center was named for **Dr.**

Thomas J. Fogarty, M.D., a 1952 graduate of RB and one of the country's leading cardiovascular surgeons and inventors.


The extravaganza began with a mass concelebrated by Fr. Jim Bok, Fr. John Bok, and Fr. Jeremy Harrington, the Provincial of the Franciscan St. John the Baptist Province. Fr. Jim Bok gave the homily at the dedication mass. After the homily, Thomas Fogarty officially dedicated the new building and Fr. Jeremy Harrington blessed the new center.

The Thomas J. Fogarty Center houses a music center, locker rooms, athletic offices, a sports medicine facility and a 1,450-seat gymnasium within its 33,000 square feet.





During an interview conducted by **Bob Stolz**, **Class of 1989**, **Dr. Fogarty** said the following: "I have always held a true sense of appreciation for all Roger Bacon has done for me. I feel good about the fact that the activity center was named after me. The most important aspects of my education was the patience the priests and brothers had with me and the potential that they helped me to realize." When asked what he remembered most of his high school days, he said he had a great time in high school, although he wasn't much of a student. His advice to students of Roger Bacon: "Pursue what you enjoy, independent of economic implications."




Some missions were nestled within the bustling campuses of the University of Santa Clara and the University of San Francisco, offering a glimpse into the intersection of academia and faith.


