CHANGES & IMPROVEMENTS



After graduation, most of us think the school building is empty and quiet, with the students out of the building. Think again... many activities continue to happen in the halls of RB. There were several projects that took place over the summer, in addition to routine cleaning, maintenance and waxing.

New windows were installed in all the remaining rooms on the front of the building. The rooms are: 35, 36, Lab B, Faculty Room, Main Office, 13, 14, 15, 16.

A Variable Refrigerant Flow (VRF) system (cooling and heat) was installed in rooms 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, and the kitchen.

The fire alarm system (approximately 500 devices) was replaced throughout the main building and Fogarty Center.

New projectors were installed in rooms 10, 12, 17, 30, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, Lab A, Lab B, 56, 57, 59, and the east wing conference room. All 3rd floor rooms were painted.

A drop ceiling was installed in the kitchen.

The **Fitness Center**, to include the weight room and multi-purpose room, was repainted. Diamond plate was installed on the multipurpose room walls.

The gym floor was refinished and the GCL logo replaced with the MVC.


The main office was repainted.

On October 27, 1929 the newly constructed Roger Bacon High School was dedicated. Later that year, a statue of Friar Roger Bacon was gifted to the school. Inscribed with his words: "That, by the help of my works, others may go forward to greater things." And, for over 90 years, we have marched forward.

- The physical footprint of our campus has changed.
- We combined with Our Lady of the Angels becoming a co-ed Franciscan school.
- Earned numerous accolades in the arts, band, Drama Guild, and athletics.

It started with a school year of everything being taken away. We saw so many of our students having difficulties adjusting to the "new" way of going to school: wearing masks, staying seated in desks, being distanced from their peers, and trying to navigate the school with a novel rule-system in place. The disappointment of not being able to attend

sporting events and the cancellation of school dances amongst so many other elements that make up the high school experience only added to the low energy we felt in our classrooms daily. As a means to instill a sort of excitement and humor back into the halls of Roger Bacon, it was decided that we obtain a vehicle that could not only transport groups of teachers to various Roger Bacon games, but could become a recognizable sign for the kids that we were attending the events that mattered so much to them during an unfortunate time when small acts mattered more than ever. What began as a search for an inexpensive investment ended in the acquisition of a high-mileage, rusty old van. Our students became just as much a part of the process as we were and it did not take long for them to begin recognizing our 1995 Chevy G20 in the parking lots of football and basketball games. Maybe the driver's side door is permanently locked, and the dashboard lights only illuminate sometimes, and the holes in the floor make for chilly winter commutes, but the van felt like normalcy in a year that was anything but that. To anyone outside of the Roger Bacon community, our van is an eyesore at best, but to the students of RB, our van is a symbol of our dedication to their lives, extending beyond the walls of our classrooms!

Over 354,000 students are involved in high school aquatics, with only 2% of these participants being recognized with the distinction of Academic All-American. Criteria for this honor includes a recipient holding a minimum grade point average of 3.75 on a 4 point scale, or 93.7500% of the grade scale used by the school without rounding up. Clarissa also holds the program record for rebounds (670) and is second in career blocks (117). She signed with the University of Cincinnati and was voted District 16 Player of the Year by coaches. She was named Division II Player of the Year and the Southwest District's Division II Player of the Year. Clarissa averaged 17.5 points and 8.9 rebounds per game and led the conference in field goal percentage and blocks, leading RB to a 14-6 record and a district finals appearance.

After graduation from RB in 1958, DR. JOHN CISE studied Physics and Math at Xavier University and graduated

in 1962. His interest in Physics continued at Cuyahoga Community College where he taught from 1964-1972. John was also a visiting Scholar at Cambridge University in England (Department of History and Philosophy of Physics) in 1988. He credits Roger Bacon High School for "doing a good job with me" and notes that his favorite teachers at RB were Fr. Lucian (Chemistry) and Fr. Peters (Math).

When John was offered a job at Cuyahoga Community

College (Cleveland, Ohio) with a salary of \$6,000 a year (twice what he was making as a high school teacher) he decided to stay in the education business because he liked teaching. He taught physics because it was fun; he was always curious and

> also enjoyed explaining things. Eventually, Dr. Cise, at 32 years old, became the initial founding Dean of Science and Math at Austin Community College (ACC), and held this position for about 10 years followed by 37 years as a Professor of Physics, before he returned to his love of teaching. John earned a MS in Physics at the University of Akron and a PhD at the University of Texas at Austin. He has also given



decade later!



FROM SAIGON TO CINCINNATI: ROGER BACON GRAD CELEBRATES FIRST ART EXHIBIT by Rob Rickenbaugh '90



This past May 14th the Caza Sikes Gallery in Cincinnati unveiled its newest exhibit, one dedicated to local artist and 1986 BACON GRADUATE HIEP NGUYEN. This exhibit,

titled "From Saigon to Cincinnati: The Works of Hiep Van Nguyen" featured over 50 pieces from Hiep, including water color and acrylic examples.

Those who attended Roger Bacon in the 1980s and 90s were familiar with the story of the Nguyen family, which immigrated to the U.S. following the fall

of Southern Vietnam in 1975. The family created a long legacy at Roger Bacon, with Hiep and his siblings, and now a new generation. Roger Bacon alums include HONG '88, MAI '91, HOA '91, MARTHA '94, SANDI '96, PETE '97, and LINDA

'98. The tradition continues with Hiep's niece BELLA (HONG)
DEVAULT will graduating in 2022, and his nephew ETHAN (MARTHA)
BUCKEY is in the class of 2024.

Hiep was always a student enamored with the arts, from film to literature to European impressionists. He was able to hone his artistic talent at Roger Bacon, where his paintings became something of a collector item, with teachers and classmates alike cherishing these works. According to Hiep:

"The person that influenced me most to paint was my art teacher at Roger Bacon, Mr. Edward Dauterich. He saw something in me my freshman year, a hint of creativity or whatever it was that he saw, it lit a spark in me. He lectured, guided and shaped me to become a painter, to love and to be creative artistically contributing a little of my own beauty, however humble and ordinary it may be to share with the world. To Edward Dauterich, I will always be grateful for his belief in a boy who had a passion for being creative but not able to live it out until he unlocked the doors to the beauty that is art."

Hiep made his artistic pursuits a lifelong endeavor, yet he had chosen not to exhibit his works until just recently. As Hiep explains "This past year, when our world was scourged with a pandemic, in my isolation and quarantine, I chose to paint, to create beauty in a not so beautiful world and

I painted some of the most beautiful paintings I've ever done in my life. I share my creations with friends and family posting my work on social media in hope that it would bring a smile or a feeling of happiness to those

who see my paintings. I wanted my artwork to lift up their spirits as it does mine and in the end, it's all that important to me."

Caza Sikes was thrilled to celebrate Hiep's works. "One can find similarities in a long line of famed Vietnamese-born impressionists, such as Le Pho (1917-2001) and Vu Cao Dam (1908-2000), whose vibrant and loose renderings seem to express a longing for a heightened aesthetic pursuit and a shunning of the mundane."

The Caza Sikes Galley, located in historic Oakley, is a venture between brothers and Roger Bacon Alums Will '98, Grayson '01 and Evan '06 Sikes.

CRAIG MCGEE JR. '17 enjoyed one of the most decorated careers in Rose-Hulman men's basketball history. He was the first 4-time all-conference selection, earned 1st team NABC All-District honors in 2020 and captured 2nd team D3 hoops.com All-Region accolades in both 2020 and 2021. Craig was also named HCAC Player of the Year in 2020; D3hoops.com Great Lakes Region Rookie of the Year in 2018, and HCAC Freshman of the Year in 2018.

He was the first player in Rose-Hulman men's basketball history to achieve career totals of 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 500 assists. He is the career school record holder with 522 assists and ranks No. 14 in school history with 1,282 career points.

In addition to his basketball career, Craig was a Dean's List honoree, a member of the National Society of Black Engineers and Intervarsity Christian Fellowship and also a club member of Catalyst, RoseBud, Fellowship of Christian Athletes and Cybersecurity there.

In his basketball career at RB, Craig ranked 9th all-time in scoring and the only RB player to play in three state tournament *Final Fours* and was the 2017 Conference Player of the Year. He was also a member of the National Honor Society and the Assisi Scholar Program.

In addition, Craig received
The Ruel Fox Burns Blanket,
and award presented to the Rose
Hulman engineering department's top
senior male and female athletes. This
blanket has been presented to outstanding engineer student-athletes since 1968.

This is the second article in a series designed to highlight the unique environment in which our Roger Bacon family connects in a welcoming and impactful way. As we march forward, we all must work together to accomplish our Franciscan mission to impact young lives and prepare them to make a difference in this world and the lives of others.

THE DAY THE WORLD CAME TO TOWN

Having just remembered the 20th anniversary of September

11, 2001, I began reading, The Day the World Came to Town by Jim DeFede. This book chronicles one of the greatest stories which occurred that day many miles away from the streets of New York. When the United States made the historic decision to close its airspace and land all air traffic as soon as possible, thirty-eight jetliners from all over the world bound for the United States were forced to land in Gander, Newfoundland, a small island town in Canada. The citizens of this small community of about 10,000 people were suddenly called upon to care for thousands of distraught travelers arriving from all parts of the world. The towns people had no idea how many planes people would arrive, what they would need or how long they might stay. Their task was daunting to say the least.

What happened in Gander over the next five days was a lesson in all that is good in humanity. The *towns people* opened their community, their homes,

and most importantly, opened their hearts to about 7,000 people from around the world from very diverse backgrounds, each with very unique needs. They created a warm and welcoming environment in which their visitors felt loved and part of the Newfoundland family. Both the *towns people* and the *plane people* were significantly impacted by the bond which was created during their stay.

THE ROGER BACON STORY

The incredible story that happened in Gander is repeated regularly in the halls of Roger Bacon. Each year a new group of freshmen encounter a warm and welcoming environment in which students can develop their confidence, feel valued

and become a vital part of the Spartan family. Senior Leaders take it upon themselves to welcome our new Spartans and to quickly assimilate them into our Franciscan values and culture. Over the next four years a transformation takes place in which our young students become compassionate leaders, confident in their own value and committed to making a significant difference in the lives of others. While I could continue to describe this transition from my own point of view, it might be more helpful to hear it in the words of some of our current students.

Braden Pinyard '24 was recently selected as one of the "Faces of RB." He has become one of the "big men on campus" despite being one the smaller kids at RB. When asked what he loves most about RB, without hesitation he responded "I love that people here see you for who you are, and that you don't have to be anything other than yourself." He looks fondly at a friendship he developed in his freshman year with Corey Kiner, then Ohio Mr. Football and now LSU running back. Only at Roger Bacon can you have such friendships develop.

Jocelyn Carraher '22 was attracted to the school by the word on the street about the sense of family exhibited here. She said, "I love the sense of community. I just don't think you see anything quite like this at other schools. It is authentic here, and personalized, and it is something that stays with you after you graduate."

As we talked, he told me he wants to come back to RB someday and give back for the valuable experience he received. I was quite impressed with his resolve to help others in memory of those who helped him.




