As you read this, Roger Bacon's 98th school year is underway. We started the year with 571 students, including a freshmen class of 145. Each year, the quality of students has increased as Roger Bacon continues to be the **most competitive** school in Cincinnati in terms of acceptance. Our reputation has grown as the **Catholic school of choice** – especially for those families looking for an unparalleled religious and academic experience in a safe and challenging environment.

There are big changes underway on our campus. The Anne Nurre Heidt Atrium, containing our first dedicated chapel, is under construction with an anticipated August 2026 completion date. Plans are underway to reclaim three classrooms during the summer of 2026 and to start construction on an expanded parking lot to provide on-campus parking for our students. Even in light of the campus improvements, Roger Bacon is the only Catholic high school in Cincinnati which did not increase tuition for the current school year. We respect the sacrifices that our families make to send their students to Roger Bacon and are committed to use the resources and gifts given to us by our supporters and alumni in an efficient and effective manner.

Roger Bacon is a school that is truly committed to providing a **student-centered** experience. Although we are in the midst of the most extensive and expensive building project in school history, we ensure tuition remains within reach for all of our families

without sacrificing a wide array of student opportunities in and out of the classroom. A cultural trip to Switzerland, Spain, and France; drama performances in Edinburgh, Scotland; music performances in Memphis, Tennessee, and an educational enrichment program at Stanford University are examples of the opportunities our students experienced this past summer beyond the walls of Roger Bacon. Annual pilgrimages to Assisi, Italy, and to the Franciscan missions in California provide students with life-changing experiences grounded in our dynamic, Franciscan charism. We have entered into an incredible agreement with Siena University which provides Roger Bacon graduates an \$80,000 scholarship - on top of financial aid and academic awards.

We invite all of our alumni and friends to visit Roger Bacon, meet our students, and experience firsthand the excitement on campus. Roger Bacon has a wonderful story to tell. As you read through the pages of this magazine, I hope you feel the energy and spirit of our school community. You should be proud of where we are and where we are going.

Team State Championships

Roger Bacon has a proud history of strong athletic programs. Over the course of nearly the past 100 years, Roger Bacon has had 36 teams showcased at the highest level of competition with 10 teams bringing home the renowned state championship trophy. For this edition we will take a closer look at the 5 most recent teams that will forever live in the history books, trophy cases, and banners in the Thomas J. Fogarty Center.

2001 Girls' Division II Volleyball State Champions

The Spartans rolled through sectional, district and regional competition without losing a set. Roger Bacon was victorious over North Bend Taylor (15-6, 15-1), Indian Hill (15-1, 15-4), and Purcell (15-1, 15-1) in the Sectional and beat Springfield Shawnee (15-3, 15-1) at Wright State University for the District Championship. The winning continued in Regional competition at Wilmington College where Plains Athens (15-3, 15-2) and Kettering Archbishop Alter (15-6, 15-8) fell in straight sets, returning the Spartans to the Final Four for the third consecutive year.

In the State Semifinal game, the Spartans took on 27-0 Millersburg West Holmes. A balanced Roger Bacon attack behind **Brittney Holden '03, Emily Withers '03** (5 kills apiece), **Jamie Gittinger '03** and **Maggie Goller '02** (4 kills apiece) led to a straight set 15-9, 15-5 victory. Setter Emily Withers added 20 assists and **Frannie Knecht '03** led the defense with 11 digs.

In the Championship match at Wright State, the Spartans shook off back-to-back Division II runner-up finishes to finally knock off two-time defending-champion Galion 15-8, 15-5. Coached by Caryl Schawe, the Spartans dominated Galion throughout the match. Brittney Holden led the Spartan attack with 12 kills and Emily Withers had 33 assists. The defense was spectacular as three Spartans had double-digit digs: Emily Withers (14), **Holly Morgan '03** (12) and Frannie Knecht (11). The team had 10 blocks, led by **Mary Brunner '03** with 4.

The Spartans roared by through Sectional competition unchallenged by defeating Bethel Tate (68-37), Western Brown (62-39) and Purcell (57-40). Roger Bacon captured the Regional championship in equally dominating fashion, beating Bishop Watterson 80-39 in the Regional Semifinals and Badin 61-47 for the Regional Championship.

In the State Semifinals, the Spartans took on Columbus Beechcroft. Roger Bacon jumped out to a 17-3 lead after the first quarter and were never challenged, winning 83-31. The 52-point margin of victory set a State Tournament record. The Spartans had a balanced scoring attack – five players scored in double figures: Monty St. Clair '03 (18), Josh Hausfeld '02 (15), Beckham Wyrick '02 (12), Frank Phillips '02 (11) and Leonard Bush '03 (10). All told, thirteen Spartans made their way onto the court during the game. Of particular note, Roger Bacon Principal Tim McCoy '02 played a busy 12 minutes in the contest - his scoring line was as follows: 0 for 2 from the field and 2-2 from the free throw line for a total of 2 points; 2 defensive rebounds, 1 personal foul, 3 assists and 2 turnovers.



Roger Bacon took on 2-time defending State Champion Akron St. Vincent - St. Mary led by "The Chosen One," LeBron James in the Championship game. Played before a sellout crowd (18,375 in attendance) at Value City Arena in Columbus, Roger Bacon avenged an earlier regular season loss by defeating Akron St. Vincent – St. Mary 71-63 to win the Division II State Championship. The game featured 7 ties and 15 lead changes. The Spartans were able to overcome a 32-point performance by LeBron James with their trademark balanced scoring attack led by Josh Hausfeld (23), Monty St. Clair (15), Beckham Wyrick (14) and Frank Phillips (13). The Spartans outrebounded their opponent 32-18, which included 13 offensive rebounds. Excellent shooting (53.1% for the game), free throws (16 of 24) and a gritty defense were keys to the game. With the victory, not only did the Spartans give LeBron James his only defeat by an Ohio high school in his career, the team is forever known as "The Team That Beat Lebron."



Roger Bacon entered the State Tournament with a 20-2 regular season record. From Sectional through Regional competition, the Spartans did not drop a set and quickly dispatched Goshen (25-2, 25-12, 25-10), Purcell (25-15, 25-21, 25-15) [Sectional Championship], Springfield Shawnee (25-13, 25-8, 25-15) [District Championship], Chillicothe Unioto (25-9, 25-12, 25-11) and Bellefontaine Benjamin Logan (25-12, 25-22, 26-24) for the Regional Championship.

The Spartans met Copley in the State Semifinal match and emerged victorious in straight sets 25-10, 25-10, 25-17. **Katie Veatch '06** led Roger Bacon with a great, all-around game – 35 assists, 4 kills, 8 digs and 2 service aces. The front line logged 46 kills, led by **Jaime Frey '06** (11), **Jessica Hoeh '05** (10), and **Alyssa Carlotta '05** (9). **Lauren Sheppard '05** led the team with 12 digs.

Roger Bacon finished a 27-2 season with a dominant 3-set victory (25-9, 25-15, 26-24) over Millersburg West Holmes to earn the second State Championship for the volleyball program. Jessica Hoeh led the team with 12 kills. The all-around play of Katie Veatch (35 assists, 11 digs), Jaime Frey (9 kills, 3 service aces, 11 digs), and Alyssa Carlotta (7 kills, 7 digs) were key to the Spartan victory.

The Spartans entered the State Tournament on a roll and it continued through Sectional, District and Regional competition. Roger Bacon did not lose a set as they beat Wilmington (25-10, 25-11, 25-3) and North Bend Taylor (25-7, 25-20, 25-1) to win the Sectional Championship, Bellbrook (25-19, 25-16, 25-8) for the District Championship, and Washington Court House (25-17, 25-6, 25-16) and Kettering Archbishop Alter (25-18, 25-23, 25-16) to win the Regional Championship and a trip to

In the State Semifinal game, the Spartans took on 24-2 River View. Roger Bacon dominated the match, winning in straight sets 25-14, 25-15, 25-14. The offense was led by **Jaime Frey '06** (11 kills) and **Heather Hausfeld '06** (10 kills). Setter **Katie Veatch '06** had 32 assists and **Vicki Auer '06** and **Katie Westerfeld '07** anchored the defense with 17 and 12 digs respectively.

The Spartans finished off a perfect 29-0 season with a 4-set 25-12, 24-26, 25-21, 25-16
Championship match win over Walsh Jesuit. The match featured 20 tie scores and 10 lead changes. After splitting the first two sets, the Spartans took control behind the balanced attack orchestrated by setter Katie Veatch, who finished the match with 62 assists. The Spartans' front line had a big day with four players recording double-digit kills – Heather Hausfeld (20), Jaime Frey (17), Katie Westerfeld (12) and **Kelsey Rose '07** (11). The defense recorded 63 digs, led by Katie Westerfeld (18), Vicki Auer (14) and Jaime Frey (12).

The Spartans rolled through Sectional and District competition beating Clinton Massie 3-0, previously undefeated Taylor 3-1 and Eaton 3-0 for the district championship. In the district finals, the Spartans earned their 7th consecutive district title led by middle blocker Raegan Waller '25 who had a dozen kills in the victory over Eaton.

The Regionals brought stiffer competition, but the Spartans responded with some of their best volleyball of the season. After a convincing 3-1 defeat of Mercy McAuley in the Regional Semifinals, the Spartans advanced to the finals to play the then number-one ranked team in the state, McNicholas. The match was no contest as the Spartans roared to a convincing straightset win (25-12, 25-21, 26-24). The team dominated from the first point and set the tone for the match with a flawless first-set victory. Opposite hitter Etellina Jackson '26 had a career highlight four blocks in the first set alone. The match was an all-out team effort to advance to the Final. Roger Bacon's dominance continued at the

In the State Semifinal game, the Spartans took on number 7 ranked Vincent Warren who entered the game with a 23-2 record. The team rallied around injured Mariah Gaines '25 and played a superb match, winning in straight sets 25-20, 25-22, and 25-9. Middle blocker Morgan Sunderman '26 had two serving runs in the second and third sets that energized the team. Raegan Waller (12) and Etellina Jackson (11) led the teams in kills. Ally Hughes '25 had 31 assists and Elizabeth Strouble '27 led the defense with 11 digs.

In the Championship match, the Spartans earned their fourth State Championship in program history by sweeping number four-ranked Alliance Marlington High School 25-22, 25-20, and 25-18 in straight sets. The Spartans were led in scoring by Raegan Waller and Etellina Jackson, each with 11 kills. Ally Hughes had 30 assists, Elizabeth Strouble finished with 13 digs and Ava Otto '25 had a great, all-around game with 6 service aces, 8 digs, and 4 kills.

Siena University's tuition and fees for 2026-27 are \$48,895, and the average merit and need-based aid awarded to students averages between \$30,000 - \$39,000.


